

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Join World Without Genocide in New York and Washington, D.C. to meet with human rights experts at the United Nations, Amnesty International, Human Rights Watch, the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum, U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, and other agencies and organizations. Explore career, internship, and volunteer opportunities in law and justice. Sightsee in two of the country's greatest cities!

AGENDA

Sunday morning- depart Minneapolis, arrive in New York.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday- meet with experts in New York.

Wednesday- depart New York, travel by train to Washington, D.C.

Thursday, Friday- meet with experts in Washington, D.C.

Saturday evening- return to Minneapolis.

Students may request to return on Friday evening or extend to Sunday. Saturday includes optional visits to the Smithsonian Museums, monuments, and other landmarks in Washington, DC.

An optional extra day (Saturday) can be arranged in New York for an additional fee.

TRAVEL DETAILS

World Without Genocide arranges meetings, accommodations, and all transportation. Travelers may arrange their own meals and evening activities or participate in optional group activities. Daily activities require rapid walking and moderate physical demands.

Minimum participants: 5. Maximum: 10.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.



COST

Due to World Without Genocide: \$1,200.00

This includes airfare, hotels, train transportation to Washington, admission to the United Nations, and a program fee.

Additional cost to participants (estimate): \$250

Travelers will be responsible for their own meals, ground transportation, and personal expenses.

Application and \$250 deposit due to World Without Genocide by Wednesday, December 2. Balance of \$950 due by Thursday, January 28.

Cancellations by February 12 will receive an 80% refund less the \$250 nonrefundable deposit.
