

Cities and states that recognize Indigenous Peoples' Day/ Native American Day

The following states have issued proclamations declaring the second Monday of October to be Indigenous Peoples' Day. Proclamations recognize the holiday but are not legally binding: Arizona, California, Idaho, Iowa, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, North Carolina, Virginia.
